


Fig.1 Space image of the Caspian Sea, February 12, 2025 (NASA/GSFC)

# FORECAST OF LEVEL AND SURGE PHENOMENA IN THE MIDDLE PART OF THE CASPIAN SEA ON FEBRUARY 13 - 18, 2025

### SEA LEVEL.

In the period on February 13 - 18, the sea level is expected to fluctuate around the mark of minus 29.51 m BS. The range of fluctuations in sea level is from minus 29.03 m to minus 29.80 m.




Fig .2 Forecast of sea level in the points of the Middle Caspian

Figure 2 shows a graph of the predicted sea level values at various points in the Middle part of the Caspian Sea.

### SURGERY PHENOMENA.

In the area of Fort-Shevchenko, Aktau, Saura, Kuryk, Fetisovo and Makhachkala, surge events are not expected, sea level fluctuations will not exceed **14 cm**.

# REVIEW CASPIAN SEA WATER STAGE FROM February 06 – 12, 2025

According to the operational data of the sea stations of Kazhydromet: Fort-Shevchenko, Aktau, Fetisovo and Roshydromet (Makhachkala), the average value of the level of the Caspian Sea, in its deep part, corresponded to minus 29.43 m, the maximum - minus 28.85 m, the minimum - minus 29.86 m.

## REVIEW OF ICE CONDITIONS IN THE CASPIAN SEA, February 06- 12, 2025

Satellite imagery (Figure 1) and operational data from marine stations and observatories along the northern coast of the Caspian Sea indicate the formation of an ice cover.




Fig. 3 Ice thickness according to operational data of marine stations




Fig. 4 Water temperature varies according operative data from Caspian Sea stations

\*\*\* Critical - 50 % frequency, danger - 25 % frequency, especially danger - 2 % frequency. The calculation was carried out for the period 1940-2020 according to the data of Peshnoy station.
